| Classes | Activities Conducted |

| Nursery to Sr. KG | Colouring sheets based on Earth, trees, and animals; nature rhymes; leaf-printing activities. |
| Grades 1 to 3 | Drawing and colouring competitions, "My Green Earth" worksheets, and sapling plantation activity. |
| Grades 4 to 5 | Poster making, slogan writing, and best-out-of-waste craft activities to promote reuse and recycling. |
| Grades 6 to 8 | Essay writing on "How Can I Save Earth?", group discussions on pollution, and environmental quiz competitions. |
| Grades 9 to 12 | Debates on "Development vs Environment," awareness presentations using charts/PPTs, and a campus awareness rally. |
