

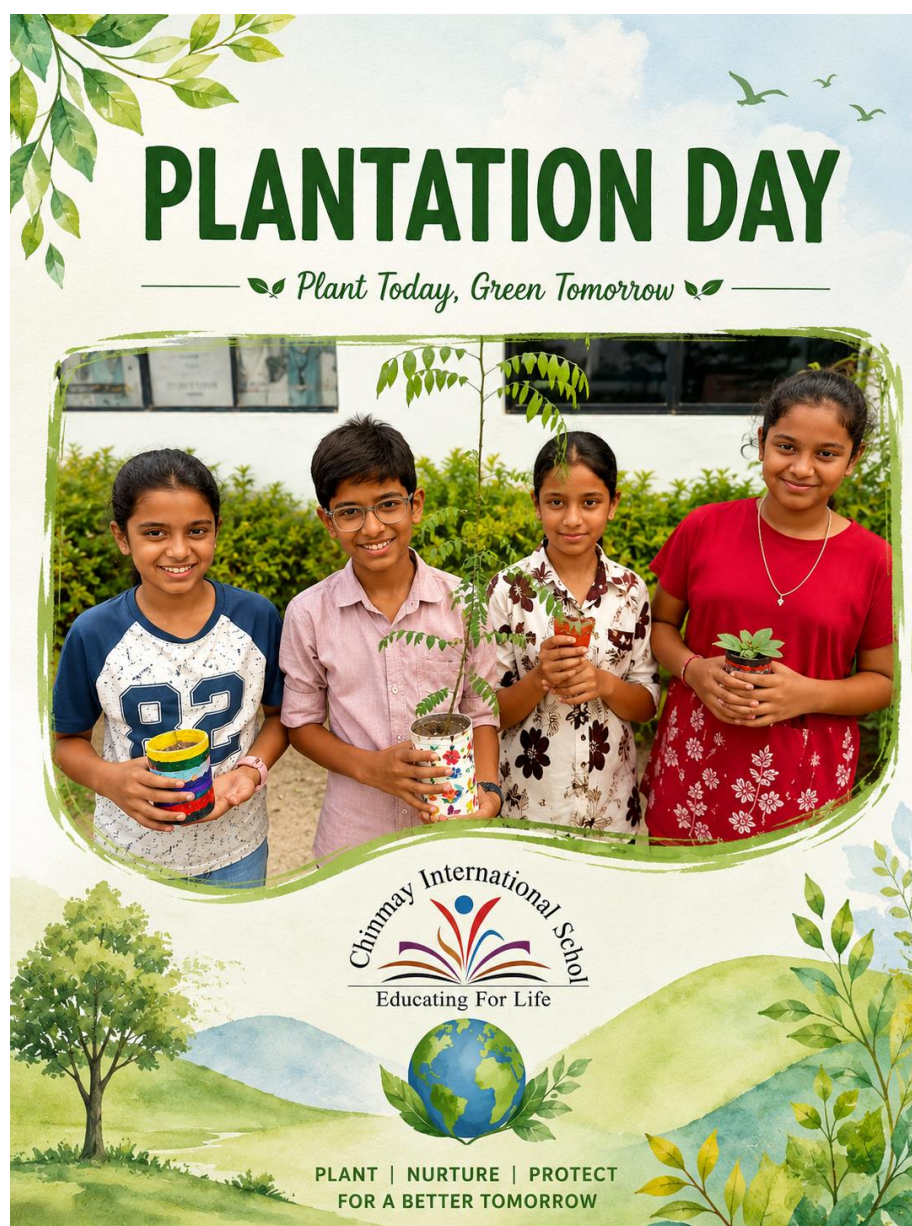
# PLANTATION DAY REPORT
